## Peter W. Parish (1951–2020)

Peter William Parish was born on 1951 February 14, became interested in astronomy at the age of nine and joined our Association in 1970 while still a teenager. He lived close enough to London to attend our meetings frequently, particularly the Exhibition meetings that used to be held once per annum, and we would often have a conversation then. He contributed a good number of regular visual observations to each of the planetary Sections over nearly four decades, from 1977 until quite recently. He concentrated his efforts upon Mars, Jupiter and Saturn, but also enjoyed finding Venus in daytime with binoculars.

Peter lived at Rainham, Gillingham, Kent. He used a 102 mm refractor and a 222 mm reflector, often also observing with the 152 mm refractor belonging to his local astronomical society, for which he served as programme secretary for around 13 years. He gave talks to other organisations, including schools as well as scout and guide groups. He was a good artist and his observations, always reliable and accurate, were appreciated by the various planetary Section Directors. Two of his Mars drawings made during an aphelic opposition are shown here, giving an indication of his skills.

Peter was adept at describing his observations, and his report of *not* having observed the 2012 solar transit of Venus is wonderfully typical of British stoicism [*Journal*, **122**, 197 (2012)]. Fortunately, he was able to enjoy many successful observations, including the spectacular 2004

solar transit of Venus and, most recently, two total solar eclipses, including one in 2017 which he observed from Wyoming in the western USA [127, 253–254 (2017)]. He was also interested in spectroscopy, geology and natural history. The Parish family would always visit any local zoo when on holiday abroad, and Peter's broad scientific enthusiasm was transmitted to all members of the family.

Peter's wife Mrs Valerie Parish writes that she met Peter through a mutual interest in astronomy: 'I wrote an essay in French saying I wanted to marry an astronomer, and as Peter's mum was my French teacher she introduced us...' That was in 1969; Peter and Val married in 1975. They had two children.Peter's death on 2020 December 8 was sudden and unexpected, and we offer our sincere condolences to his family.


