

The transit of Venus, 2004 June 8




Right: A comparison of images of the Mercury and Venus transits by James Weightman, Cirencester, Glos.

'The event was seen under near perfect weather conditions at the home of Sir Patrick Moore [Selsey, Sussex]. It was an unforgettable event, with many other observers present, including Dr Brian May. A great variety of telescopes were present also, from Halpha to simple projection, and Venus was easily seen as a tiny disk with the naked eye + solar viewer. No black drop effect was seen at ingress or egress, with webcam imagery or visually.'
