#### Our Hosts - Eastbourne Astronomical Society

The society was originally formed in spring 1960. There are over 120 members with over 60 regularly attending the monthly lectures. It is predominantly a 'lecture' society, partly due to the demographics of the local area. Public observing sessions are held at the Redoubt, a Napoleonic Fort on Eastbourne sea front. These are held at monthly intervals and there are also public viewing events, free of charge, on the sea front when astronomical events such as the Transit of Mercury occur. Several members are active observers either visually or photographically.
