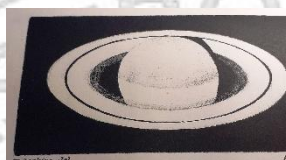
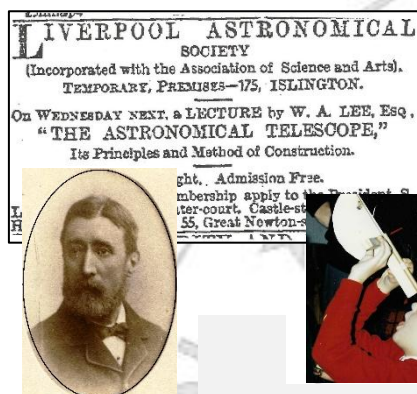


Liverpool Astronomical Society Celebrating 145 Years of Astronomy on Merseyside. 1881 – 2026

The Liverpool Astronomical Society is one of the oldest in Great Britain, for 145 years it has enabled amateur astronomers to meet, communicate observations, and to discuss the construction and the use of telescopes, while promoting the science of astronomy to the wider public.

To help celebrate this special anniversary, a small but significant free exhibition and display, will trace some important stages in the story of the society. In the first 10 years of its formation, the society fundamentally changed how amateur astronomy was organised in this country and the wider world.

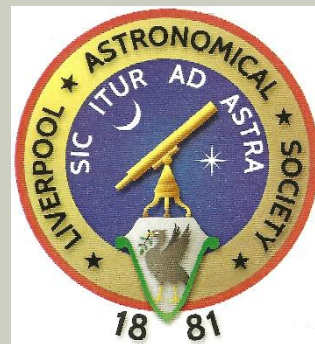
It's early success, and longevity is demonstrated with the display of selected items from the society archives with the kind cooperation of the Liverpool Record Office and Archives Department.
