in Suffolk. Elected a member in 1911, she took an active part in observational astronomy and acted with Mrs F. Wilson as deputy to the Rev. Martin Davidson, then Director of the Meteor Section, during his service in the 1914-18 war. She held the post of Director from 1920 to 1923. In 1920 she was awarded the E. C. Pickering Fellowship for Women Astronomers. She was with four others the first of her sex to be elected to Fellowship of the R.A.S. in 1916. Her interest in astronomy persisted into later life and she became a founder member of the Ipswich and District Astronomical Society as recently as 1950. We mourn the passing of one of England's most distinguished women astronomers.
