

MR. G. L. BROWN.—We regret to learn of the death, on January 6, of Mr. George L. Brown, late of Stirling, N.B. Mr. Brown early began to take an interest in astronomy and made a small telescope for himself when about 15 years of age. He afterwards obtained a $3\frac{1}{2}$ -in. refractor and $10\frac{1}{4}$ -in. reflector, and pursued his astronomical studies with great enthusiasm, until interrupted by failing health a little over a year ago. He was for some time a member of the Liverpool Astronomical Society, and joined its Lunar Section. He was an original member of the British Astronomical Association, and took part in the work of the Mars Section. He was also a member of the short-lived Stirling Astronomical Society, which was formed after an observatory had been added to the High School of that town. Mr. Brown's artistic ability was of great service to him in his astronomical observations, as it enabled him to record accurately what he saw.
