

THE LATE MR. HERBERT SADLER.—We regret to learn of the sudden death of Mr. Herbert Sadler, on the 1st of June. Mr. Sadler was the son of the late Prebendary Sadler, and was born in 1856. He became a Fellow of the Royal Astronomical Society in 1876, and was for a short time on its Council in 1879. To the Society he communicated several papers, and in 1886 he published "The Star Guide," a list of the most remarkable celestial objects visible with small telescopes, in conjunction with Mr. Latimer Clark. To "Knowledge" he also contributed the monthly "Face of the Sky," and he wrote occasionally on astronomical subjects to the "English Mechanic." His writings, however, give but a very imperfect idea of his real ability. His memory was unusually good, almost phenomenal, and his knowledge of the entire literature of double star work most comprehensive and complete. He was an original Member of the Association.
