Mr. W. Coleman, F.R.A.S.

The death of William Coleman, who was elected a Fellow of the Royal Astronomical Society in 1884 and was an original Member of our Association, took place on the 9th of April, at

the age of 87. Of late years Mr. Coleman had resided at Buckland, near Dover, where he set up an 8-inch Cooke equatorial and obtained a large number of observations of double stars, the results of which were published in the Memoirs of the Royal Astronomical Society. W. T. L.
